Fabric A 80760-48	1 3/8 yds	Cut 2 – 4 1/2" x WOF strips Sub-cut 18 – 4 1/2" squares (for Block 1) Cut 8 – 4 1/2" x WOF strips (for Outer Border)
Fabric B 80761-44	1 5/8 yds	Cut 7 – 2" x WOF strips (for Block 1 & 2) Cut 7 – 2 ½" x WOF strips (for Inner Border) Cut 9 – 2 ½" x WOF strips (set aside for binding)
Fabric C 80761-53	1 yd	Cut 14 – 2" x WOF strips (for Block 1 & 2)
Fabric D 80763-61	1/2 yd	Cut 7 – 2" x WOF strips (for Block 1 & 2)
Fabric E 80764-63	7/8 yd	Cut 3 – 7" x WOF strips ➤ Sub-cut 18 – 7" squares (for Block 1) Cut 2 – 2" x WOF strips (for Block 2)
Fabric F 81230-59	1 1/8 yds	 Cut 6 – 3 ¼" x WOF strips Sub-cut 72 – 3 ¼" squares; cut each square once on the diagonal (for Block 1) Cut 2 – 2" x WOF strips (for Block 2) Cut 8 – 1 ½" x WOF strips (for middle Border)
Fabric G 81600-30	3 1/4 yds	 Cut 3 - 7" x WOF strips Sub-cut 18 - 7" squares (for Block 1) Cut 19 - 3 ¼" x WOF strips Sub-cut 72 - 3 ¼" squares; cut each square once on the diagonal (for Block 1) Sub-cut 170 - 3 ¼" squares; cut each square once on the diagonal (for Block 2) Cut 6 - 4 ½" x WOF strips Sub-cut 68 - 4 ½" squares (for Block 2)
Lengthwise Backing 80764-63	7 1/2 yds	Cut fabric in half along the length to get 2 – 3 ¾ yd pieces. Sew pieces together along the selvage edges to get a backing piece measuring approximately 85″ x 134″.

<u>HST Unit:</u>

- 1. Pair each Fabric E 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square with a Fabric G 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square.
- 2. With right sides together, sew a ¼" seam around the outer edges.
- 3. Cut on both diagonals to get four pieces. Open and press to the dark fabric.
- 4. Repeat to make 72 HST Units.

Square-in-a-Square 4-Patch Unit A:

- Sew a Fabric B 2" x WOF strip together with a Fabric C 2" x WOF strip to create a B-C strip set. Press toward the dark fabric. Repeat to make a total of 7 B-C strip sets.
- 2. Sub-cut the B-C strip sets into $140 2'' \times 3 \frac{1}{2}''$ 2-Patch Units (for Block 1 & 2).
- 3. Sew a Fabric C 2" x WOF strip together with a Fabric D 2" x WOF strip to create a C-D strip set. Press toward the dark fabric. Repeat to make a total of 7 C-D strip sets.
- 4. Sub-cut the C-D strip sets into $140 2'' \times 3 \frac{1}{2}''$ 2-Patch Units (for Block 1 & 2).
- 5. Sew a B-C 2-Patch Unit together with a C-D 2-Patch Unit, turning one unit in the opposite direction to create a BCD 4-Patch Unit.
- 6. Sew a Fabric F triangle on the top and right edges of the 4-Patch Unit, lining up the long edge of the triangle with the edges of the 4-Patch and centering the triangle point to the center seam of the 4-patch. Press triangles out after each is added.
- 7. Sew a Fabric G triangle on the bottom and left edges of the 4-Patch Unit in the same manner to complete the Square-in-a-Square 4-Patch Unit A. Trim unit to 4 ½" x 4 ½".
- Repeat to make a total of 140 Square-in-a-Square 4-Patch Unit A's. (70 for Block 1 & 70 for Block 2).

Block 1 Assembly:

- 1. Lay out four HST Units and four Square-in-a-Square 4-Patch Unit A's with a Fabric A 4 ½" square as shown below.
- Sew units together into rows. Then sew rows together to complete Block 1. Repeat to make a total of 18 Block 1's.















Square-in-a-Square 4-Patch Unit B:

- 1. Sew a Fabric E 2" x WOF strip together with a Fabric F 2" x WOF strip to create an E-F strip set. Press toward the dark fabric. Repeat to make a total of two E-F strip sets.
- 2. Sub-cut the E-F strip sets into $34 2'' \times 3 \frac{1}{2}''$ 2-Patch Units.
- 3. Sew two E-F 2-Patch Units together, turning one unit in the opposite direction to create an EF 4-Patch Unit.
- 4. Sew a Fabric G triangle on the top and bottom edges of the 4-Patch Unit, lining up the long edge of the triangle with the edges of the 4-Patch and centering the triangle point to the center seam of the 4-patch. Press triangles out.
- 5. Sew a Fabric G triangle on the right and left edges of the 4-Patch Unit in the same manner to complete the Square-in-a-Square 4-Patch Unit B. Trim unit to 4 ½" x 4 ½".
- 6. Repeat to make a total of 17 Square-in-a-Square 4-Patch Unit B's.


Block 2 Assembly:


- 1. Lay out four Square-in-a-Square 4-Patch Unit A's and one Square-in-a-Square 4-Patch Unit B with four Fabric G 4 ½" squares as shown below.
- 2. Sew units together into rows. Then sew rows together to complete Block 2. Repeat to make a total of 17 Block 2's.











QUILT TOP ASSEMBLY

1. Lay out blocks in seven rows of five blocks each, alternating Block 1 & 2 as shown below.



- 2. Sew Blocks together into rows. Then sew rows together to complete the quilt center.
- 3. Join the 7 − 2 ½" Fabric B inner border strips end to end. From the long strip, cut 2 − 2 ½" x 84 ½" strips and add to each side of the quilt top. Press toward the border. Then cut 2 − 2 ½" x 64 ½" strips and add to the top & bottom of the quilt top. Press toward the border.
- Join the 8 − 1 ½" Fabric F middle border strips end to end. From the long strip, cut 2 − 1 ½" x 88 ½" strips and 2 − 1 ½ x 66 ½" strips. Add to the quilt top in the same manner as in Step 3.
- 5. Join the 8 4 ½" Fabric A outer border strips end to end. From the long strip, cut 2 4 ½" x 90 ½" strips and 2 4 ½" x 74 ½" strips. Add to the quilt top in the same manner as in Step 3.
- 6. Join the nine Fabric B binding strips using diagonal seams. Fold in half along the length of the strip with wrong sides together and press.
- 7. Layer quilt top with batting and prepared backing. Quilt as desired.
- 8. Bind using your favorite method.
