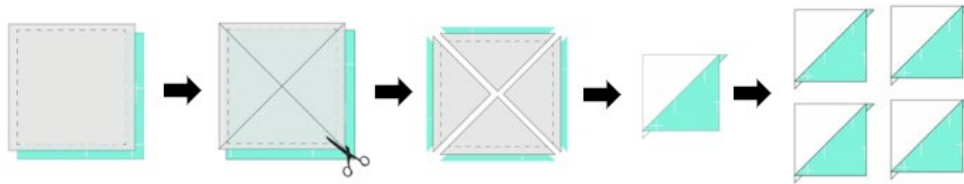

Fabric	Yardage	Cutting Instructions (WOF = width of fabric)
*DP28655-54 	1 – 24" x 21" Panel	Trim panel to 23 1/2" x 20 1/2"
Option 1: Fabric A 9030-51 Canvas <u>OR</u> Option 2: Fabric A 9020-12 Toscana 	3/4 yd	Cut 4 – 2 1/2" x WOF strips ➤ Sub-cut 2 – 2 1/2" x 24 1/2" strips; 2 – 2 1/2" x 21 1/2" strips; and 16 – 2 1/2" squares Cut 3 – 2" x WOF strips ➤ Sub-cut 16 – 2" x 3 1/2" rectangles and 16 – 2" squares Cut 2 – 4 1/2" x WOF strips ➤ Sub-cut 4 – 4 1/2" x 8 1/2" and 4 – 4 1/2" x 7" rectangles ➤ Trim remainder of strip to 4"; cut 2 – 4" squares
Fabric B 9020-24 Toscana 	1/4 yd	Cut 1 – 3 1/4" x WOF strip ➤ Sub-cut 4 – 3 1/4" squares Cut 1 – 2" x WOF strip ➤ Sub-cut 16 – 2" squares
Fabric C 9020-580 Toscana 	1/4 yd	Cut 1 – 3 1/4" x WOF strip ➤ Sub-cut 4 – 3 1/4" squares Cut 1 – 2" x WOF strip ➤ Sub-cut 16 – 2" squares
Fabric D 9020-231 Toscana 	1/8 yd	Cut 1 – 2 1/2" x WOF strip ➤ Sub-cut 8 – 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles
Fabric E 9020-531 Toscana 	1/6 yd	Cut 1 – 4" x WOF strip ➤ Sub-cut 2 – 4" squares ➤ Trim remainder of strip to 2 1/2"; cut 8 – 2 1/2" squares
Option 1: Fabric F 9020-721 Toscana <u>OR</u> Option 2: Fabric F 9020-271 Toscana 	3/8 yd	Cut 3 – 1" x WOF strips Cut 4 – 2 1/4" x WOF strips; set aside for Binding
Backing 9020-580 Toscana 	1 1/4 yds	No cutting required.

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Corner Block Assembly Instructions:

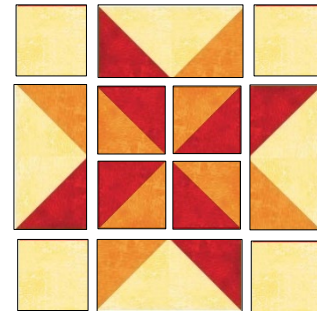
1. Lay out the 4 – 3 ¼” Fabric B & Fabric C squares. Pair each together, right sides together, and make HST’s following the ‘4-at-a-time’ method, as shown below. Make a total of 16 HST’s.



2. Lay out the 16 – 2” x 3 ½” Fabric A rectangles and the 16 – 2” Fabric B & Fabric C squares. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of the squares. Place a Fabric B square on the left side of the rectangle, right sides together, and sew along the marked line. Trim a ¼” seam allowance, open and press the triangle. In the same manner, add the Fabric C square to the opposite side of the rectangle to complete the Flying Geese unit. Repeat to make 16 Flying Geese units.



3. Lay out the HST’s, the Flying Geese units and 2” Fabric A squares as shown.
4. Sew units together in each row. Then sew rows together to complete the corner block. Repeat to make four corner blocks.



Outer Border Assembly Instructions:

1. Lay out 8 – 2 ½” x 4 ½” Fabric D rectangles, 8 – 2 ½” Fabric E squares and 8 – 2 ½” Fabric A squares. Draw a horizontal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of all 2 ½” squares. Place a Fabric E square on the left edge of the Fabric D rectangle and a Fabric A square on the right edge. Sew along the marked lines, trim ¼” seam allowances and press the remaining triangles out to the corners of the rectangle. Make four in this configuration (Diagram 1) and four in the opposite configuration (Diagram 2). Sew together to complete four Unit 1a’s (Diagram 3).

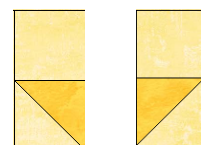

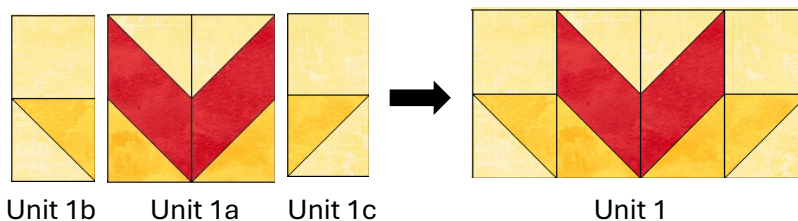

2. Pair the 4” Fabric A & Fabric E squares with right sides together and pin in place. Following the 4-At-A-Time HST method (as shown in Step 1), sew around the perimeter of the squares at ¼” and cut from corner to corner on both diagonals to make four HST’s from each set of squares (for a total of eight HST’s).
3. Pair each HST with a 2 ½” Fabric A square and sew together, noting the placement of the HST’s as shown. Make four with each placement (4 - Unit 1b’s and 4 – Unit 1c’s).

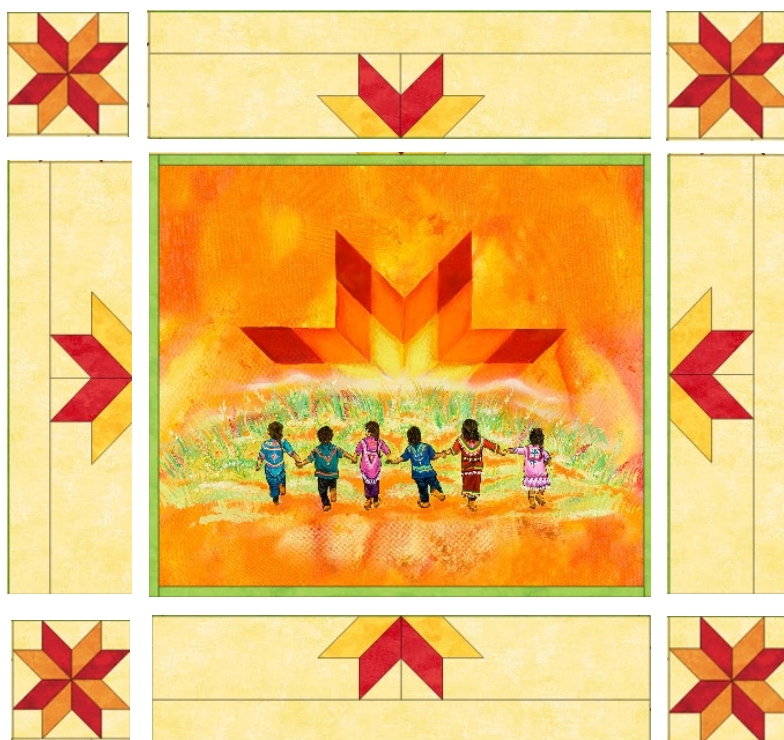
4. Add a Unit 1b and Unit 1c to each side of Unit 1a, as shown above, to complete Unit 1. Make four Unit 1's.



5. Add a $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A rectangle to each side of two Unit 1's and a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $24\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A strip to the top edge of each to complete the top & bottom border strips.
6. Add a $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x 7" Fabric A rectangle to each side of the remaining two Unit 1's and a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $21\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A strip to the top edge of each to complete the side border strips.

Quilt Top Assembly:

1. Sew the 3 – 1" Fabric F strips together end to end. From this long strip, cut 2 – $20\frac{1}{2}$ " side inner border strips and 2 – $24\frac{1}{2}$ " top & bottom inner border strips. Add the side border strips to the panel and then the top & bottom border strips to frame the panel.
2. Lay out the framed center panel with the four corner blocks and four pieced border strips as shown.
3. Sew the side border strips to each side of the center panel.
4. Sew a corner block to each end of the top & bottom border strips. Then add the top & bottom border strips to complete the quilt top.



5. Join the Fabric F binding strips using diagonal seams. Fold in half along the length of the strip, wrong sides together, and press.
6. Layer the quilt top with batting and backing. Quilt as desired. Bind using your favorite method.
