


Fabric A 40049-46 	1/2 yd	Cut 2 – 6 ½" x WOF strips <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Sub-cut 4 – 6 ½" x 12 ½" rectangles & 3 - 6 ½" x 6 ½" squares
Fabric B 40051-54 	5/8 yd	Cut 3 – 6 ½" x WOF strips <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Sub-cut 7 – 6 ½" x 12 ½" rectangles & 1 - 6 ½" x 6 ½" square
Fabric C 40052-78 	5/8 yd	Cut 3 – 6 ½" x WOF strips <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Sub-cut 6 – 6 ½" x 12 ½" rectangles & 1 – 6 ½" x 6 ½" square
Fabric D 40048-99 	1/2 yd	Cut 2 – 6 ½" x WOF strips <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Sub-cut 5 – 6 ½" x 12 ½" rectangles & 2 - 6 ½" x 6 ½" squares
Fabric E 40046-54 	2/3 yd (1 Panel)	Cut 3 – 6 ½" x WOF strips <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Sub-cut 7 – 6 ½" x 12 ½" rectangles & 1 - 6 ½" x 6 ½" square
Fabric F 40009-74 (Plaster of Paris) 	5/8 yd	Cut 3 – 6 ½" x WOF strips <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Sub-cut 7 – 6 ½" x 12 ½" rectangles
Fabric G 40047-45 	1 3/8 yds	Cut 3 – 6 ½" x WOF strips <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Sub-cut 9 – 6 ½" x 12 ½" rectangles Cut 2 – 12 ½" x WOF strips <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Sub-cut 9 – 12 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles & 4 - 6 ½" x 6 ½" squares
Fabric H 40009-46 (Plaster of Paris) 	1/2 yd	Cut 7 – 2 ¼" x WOF strips for binding
Backing (Crosswise) 40052-78 	4 yds	Cut in half along the length of fabric to get 2 – 2 yd x WOF pieces. Sew pieces together along the selvage edges for a backing piece measuring approximately 72" x 84"

QUILT TOP ASSEMBLY:

- Using the quilt image as a guide for fabric placement, sew rectangles together to complete each row, beginning and ending with a square on rows 1, 3, 5, 7, 9 & 11.
- Sew rows together two at a time, i.e. sew rows 1 & 2, then rows 3 & 4, etc. Then join the row sets together. This will keep the size more manageable to work with.
- Layer completed quilt top with batting and backing. Quilt as desired.
- Join binding strips end to end using diagonal seams. Fold in half wrong sides together along the length of the strip and press. Bind quilt using your favorite method.
