Fabric Collection: COASTAL CHRISTMAS

Finished Size: Approximately 41 ½" x 47 ½" each

WOF = width of fabric

All seams are sewn using a ¼" seam allowance

Fabric requirements for Both Projects	Yardage	Cutting Instructions
Fabric A – Center Panel DP23424-44	3/4 yard (1 Panel)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Trim Panel to 21" (width) x 27" (length) NOTE: See "Trimming a Panel" under the Quilting Tips in the Resources Section of our website – Northcott.com
Fabric B - Border DP23425-11	3 yards	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Along the length of fabric, cut the border stripe into four identical sections, each approximately 10 ¾" (one repeat of the print for each section).
Fabric C – Binding 23430-46	2/3 yard	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Cut 10 – 2 ¼" x WOF strips. Set aside for binding (5 strips for each project).
Backing 23428-44	3 yards	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Cut backing fabric in half to get two 1 ½ yd x WOF pieces (one for each project).

Assembly Instructions:

1. Fold each border strip in half crosswise; press lightly to mark centers. Fold panel in half in each direction and press lightly to mark center of each edge. Pin a border strip to each side of the panel, matching the center marks and allowing excess border strip to extend beyond the corner edges. Sew together, beginning and ending the seam ¼" from the corner of the panel. Repeat to sew border strips to top & bottom edges. Press all seams toward the borders.
2. To miter each corner, lay out the border strips beyond the corner edge, overlapping one strip on the other. Align the edge of a 90° right triangle ruler with the raw edge of the top strip so the triangle's long edge intersects the border seam in the corner. Draw a line along the ruler's edge from the seam out to the raw edge (see Diagram 1). Place the bottom border strip on top and repeat the marking process. With right sides together, match marked seam lines and pin (see Diagram 2). Beginning at the outside corner, sew the strips together, stitching exactly on the marked lines. Check the right side to see that the corner lies flat. Trim excess fabric, leaving a ¼" seam allowance. Press seam open. Repeat for each corner.

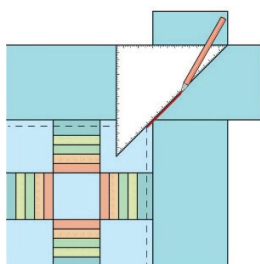

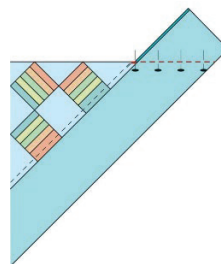

3. Join binding fabric strips together and prepare binding.
4. Layer quilt top with batting & backing. Quilt as desired. Bind using your favorite method.
