DP25586-11	3/4 yd (1 Panel)	Trim to 27 ½" x 42 ½"
W25572-23 W25573-24 W25574-76 W25575-54 W25576-76 W25577-76 W25578-24 W25579-24 W25580-44 W25581-74 W25582-76 W25583-76 W25584-96 W25585-42	1/8 yd (or Fat Eighth) each	From each, cut 1 – 3 ½ X WOF strip ➤ From each strip, sub-cut 3 to 4 3 ½" squares (You will need 54 squares)
25587-24 (Outer border)	1/3 yd	Cut 5 – 2" x WOF strips ➤ Join strips as needed to sub-cut 2 – 2" x 51 ½" strips and 2 – 2" x 39 ½" strips
9030-24 (Inner Border & Binding)	2/3 yd	Cut 4 – 2" x WOF strips ➤ Sub-cut 2 – 2" x 42 ½" strips and 2 – 2" x 30 ½" strips Cut 5 – 2 ½" x WOF strips (Set aside for binding)
Backing (Choose your favorite plaid from the collection)	2 yds	No cutting required.

#### Instructions:

1. Add top & bottom inner borders to trimmed panel, pressing seams toward the borders; then add side borders in the same manner.

# *NOTE: Visit the Resources section on our website for tips on trimming panels and adding coping strips.*

- 2. Randomly join the 3 ½" tartan squares (or refer to the quilt image for placement). Join 15 squares for each top & border border and 12 squares for each side border. Measure and trim the length of each pieced strip if necessary.
- 3. Add top & bottom tartan borders to the quilt top, then add side borders, pressing toward the inner border.
- 4. Add outer borders in the same manner, pressing toward the outer border.
- 5. Join binding strips using diagonal seams. Fold in half, wrong sides together, along the length of the strip and press.
- 6. Layer quilt top with batting & backing. Quilt as desired. Bind using your favorite method.
