

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
# Lustrous Wreath Wall Hanging

**Collections:** *Lurex Woven, Shimmer Radiance & Simply Neutral 2*

**Finished Size:** 17 ½" x 25 ½"


**WOF** = Width of Fabric

All seams are sewn using a ¼" seam allowance


Requirement	Yardage	Cutting Instructions
 <p>Fabric A - 21246W-49 (Lurex Woven-Blue)</p>	1/2 yd	Cut 1 – 6 ½" x WOF strip <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Sub-cut 1 – 6 ½" square</li> <li>• Sub-cut 2 – 6" squares</li> <li>• Sub-cut 3 – 5 ½" squares</li> <li>• Sub-cut 4 – 2" squares</li> </ul> Cut 3 – 2 ¼" x WOF strips (set aside for binding)
 <p>Fabric B - 21246W-100 (Lurex Woven-White)</p>	1/4 yd	Cut 2 – 2 ½" x WOF strips <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Sub-cut 20 – 2 ½" squares</li> </ul>
 <p>Fabric C - 9050M-95 (Shimmer Radiance)</p>	1 Fat Quarter	Cut 3 – 2 ½" x 21" strips <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Sub-cut 20 – 2 ½" squares</li> </ul> From the remaining fabric, cut 1 – 6 ½" square
 <p>Fabric D - 23919-10 (Simply Neutral 2)</p>	1/3 yd	Cut 1 – 6" x WOF strip <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Sub-cut 2 – 6" squares</li> <li>• Sub-cut 1 – 5 ½" square</li> </ul> Cut 3 – 1 ½" x WOF strips <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Sub-cut 4 – 1 ½" x 15 ½" strips</li> <li>• Sub-cut 2 – 1 ½" x 25</li> </ul>
 <p>Crosswise Backing 23918-98 (Simply Neutral 2)</p>	5/8 yd	No cutting required.

## Block Assembly:


1. Take one 6" Fabric A square & one 6" Fabric D square. Place squares right sides together and draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the Fabric D square. Pin together. Sew a scant ¼" away from both sides of the drawn line. Cut apart on the drawn line to yield two half square triangle units. Press toward the darker fabric. Repeat this process with the second 6" Fabric A & D squares to yield 4 A-D HST units. Trim these HST Units to 5 ½".




- Take the 5 1/2" Fabric D square and 4 - 2" Fabric A squares. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side each Fabric A square. Place a Fabric A square in each corner of the Fabric D square. Sew along the drawn lines and cut off excess fabric 1/4" above the seam line. Press seams open.



- Layer the 6 1/2" Fabric A square and the 6 1/2" Fabric C square with right sides together. Pin in place. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner and stitch 1/4" away from the drawn line on both sides. Cut the stitched unit apart on the drawn line. Press the units open toward the darker fabric. Draw a diagonal line perpendicular with the sewn seam on one of the units. With right sides together, layer the two sewn units. Nest the seams and pin in place. Stitch 1/4" away from both sides of the drawn line. Cut the unit apart on the drawn line and press open.



- Arrange the units, along with 3 - 5 1/2" Fabric A squares as shown below. Sew blocks together into rows, pressing seams in the opposite direction on every other row so they will nest when sewing the rows together. This completes the Wreath Block.




- Using the Fabric B & C 2 1/2" squares, make HST units following Step 1 instructions & diagram. Repeat to yield 40 C-D HST Units. Trim these HST Units to 2".

- Sew HST Units together in blocks of four to create Pinwheel Units as shown.



- Sew five Pinwheel Units together and add a Fabric D 1 1/2" x 15 1/2" strip to the top & bottom. This completes the Pinwheel Block row. Make 2.



- Add a Pinwheel Block row to the top and bottom of the Wreath Block.

- Add a 1 1/2" x 25 1/2" strip to each side to complete the quilt top.

- Layer quilt top with batting & backing. Quilt as desired.

- Join Fabric A binding strips end-to-end with diagonal seams and press in half lengthwise. Bind using your favorite method.
