## Oansy Trellis

Designed by Patti Carey using Northcott's Pretty Face collection, a Quest for a Cure ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ collection by Ro Gregg
Stitch this generous lap quilt in shades of pretty pink or vibrant violet. Careful placement of the sashing and cornerstone pieces creates a delightful woven effect

Finished Quilt Size: 591/2" $\times 781 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Number of Blocks \& Finished Size: thirty-five $71 / 2$ " blocks with 2" sashing and 5 " borders
Skill level: Advanced beginner

| Fabric Requirements | Violet | Rose | Yards | Cutting Instructions |

| Fabric A - border | 2342-81 | 2343-65 | $11 / 3 \mathrm{yds}$ | Cut 8 strips $51 / 4$ " $\times$ width of fabric (wof); join in 4's and cut (2) 82 " pieces \& (2) 62 " pieces. From scraps, cut (7) $2^{1 ⁄ 2} /{ }^{\prime \prime}$ squares; cut 2 squares once diagonally and 5 squares twice diagonally. |
| Fabric B - sashing ground | 2343-65 | 2343-68 | 1yd | Cut 17 strips $1 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ wof. Cut 3 strips $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ wof; cut into (48) $2 \frac{1}{2} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares. |
| Fabric C - yellow sashing | 2343-51 | 2343-53 | 3/4yd | Cut 17 strips $1^{\prime \prime} \times$ wof. <br> Cut 5 strips $1-1 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times$ wof; cut into (48) $33 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ pieces. |
| Fabric D - sashing contrast | 2343-86 | 2343-21 | 3/4yd | Cut 17 strips 1 " $x$ wof. <br> Cut 5 strips $1-1 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times$ wof; cut into (44) $33 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ pieces. |
| Fabric E-Ig. pansy | 2337-86 | 2337-65 | 1/4yd | Cut 1 strip 8" x wof; cut into (5) 8" squares. |
| Fabric F - sm. pansy | 2341-51 | 2341-65 | 1/4yd | Cut 1 strip 8" x wof; cut into (5) 8" squares. |
| Fabric G - water cans | 2340-81 | 2340-21 | 1/4yd | Cut 1 strip 8" $\times$ wof; cut into (5) 8" squares. |
| Fabric H-med. pansy | 2338-81 | 2338-21 | 1/4yd | Cut 1 strip 8" x wof; cut into (5) 8" squares. |
| Fabric I - pastel blur | 2339-81 | 2339-21 | 1/4yd | Cut 1 strip $8^{\prime \prime} \times$ wof; cut into (5) 8" squares. |
| Fabric J - dark blur | 2339-86 | 2339-27 | $1 / 4 y d$ | Cut 1 strip 8" x wof; cut into (5) 8" squares. |
| Fabric K - blur/stripe | 2339-68 | 2342-21 | 1/4yd | Cut 1 strip 8" x wof; cut into (5) 8" squares. |
| Fabric L-binding | 2343-68 | 2342-21 | 5/8 yd | Cut 7 strips $2^{1 / 2}{ }^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{x}$ wof; join end-to-end, press in half and reserve for binding. |
| Backing - large pansy | 2337-86 | 2337-65 | $32 / 3 \mathrm{yds}$ | Cut a piece 84" long. Cut balance in half lengthwise, join end-to-end and sew to side of 84 " piece. |
| Batting | a piece $64 " \times 83$ " |  |  |  |

## Piecing

## Sashing:

1. Sew a Fabric $C$ strip to one side and a Fabric $D$ strip to the other side of each Fabric B strip, pressing seams toward C/D. Cut into (82) 8" pieces
2. Cut each $2^{11 / 2 "}$ Fabric $B$ square once diagonally.

3. Center and sew a Fabric B triangle to each side of a $33 / 4$ " Fabric $D$ piece, pressing seam toward $D$. Square up block by trimming ends of $D$ strip using the corner of your rotary cutting ruler or a small square template such as Omnigrid's $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square. Cut unit once diagonally, from green corner to green corner.
4. Center and sew a cut unit from step 3 to each side of (24) 33/4" Fabric C pieces, pressing seams toward $C$. Square up block by trimming off ends of $C$ as in step 3. These units are the inner cornerstone units.
5. Center and sew a cut unit from step 3 to ONE side of (4) $33 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric C pieces. Center and sew a larger Fabric A triangle to other side; press seams toward C. Square up block as in step 4. These are the 4 corner units.
6. Remove a Fabric B corner as shown from 10 cut units from step 3 above, replacing it with a small Fabric A triangle. Center and sew these units to ONE side of (10) $33 / 4$ " Fabric C pieces, and sew an unaltered cut unit to the other side; press seams toward C , and square up block.

7. Repeat step 6 with 10 more cut units, this time removing the adjacent corner and replacing it with a Fabric A triangle


## Assembly

1. Referring to the photo, lay out the 8 " squares of Fabrics E, F, G, H, I, J \& K in 7 rows of 5
2. Insert a sashing unit between blocks and around edges, paying careful attention to the alignment of the sashing units. Note that alternate blocks, including the 4 corners, are framed in Fabric D, while the balance of the blocks are framed in Fabric C
3. Insert the inner cornerstone units between the sashing units in the interior of the quilt, again paying careful attention to the direction of the Fabric C strips (the cornerstones will connect the Fabric C framed blocks)
4. Add the corner cornerstones at the 4 corners
5. Add the balance of the cornerstones, alternating units from step 6 and step 7 above
6. Sew the units into sashing rows and block rows, pressing seams toward sashing units
7. Sew the rows together, pressing seams toward sashing units.
8. Center and sew an 82 " Fabric A piece to each side of the quilt, sewing from seam line to seam line and backstitching at each end. Center and sew a $62^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A piece to top and bottom edges
9. Miter the corners using your favourite method, pressing seams toward sashing.

## Finishing:

Layer the prepared backing, batting and quilt top. Baste and quilt as desired. You may wish to stitch in the ditch in the sashing and cornerstone units, and add a pretty quilting motif in the blocks and border. Trim the edges even with quilt top. Sew the prepared Fabric $L$ binding to the edges, turn and stitch in place
