## **Hanging Out**

Finished Size: 47" by 56"

wof = width of fabric

Fabric requirements	Yards	Cutting Instructions
<b>Fabric A</b> - Panel (#22132-10)	One panel	• Trim panel to 23 ½" by 42 ½"
<b>Fabric B</b> - Blue/green circle (#22064-10) Side border	¾ yard	• Cut two (2) strips measuring 5 1/2" by wof (side border)
<b>Fabric C</b> - Stripe (#22065-47) Inner border	¾ yard	• Cut four (4) strips measuring 2 ½" by wof
<b>Fabric D</b> - Blue/green leaf (#22062-47) Outer border/binding	1½ yard	<ul> <li>Cut six (6) strips measuring 5 ½" by wof</li> <li>Join end to end with a diagonal seam for the outer border</li> <li>Cut six (6) strips measuring 2 ½" by wof</li> <li>Join end to end with a diagonal seam for the binding</li> </ul>
<b>Backing</b> (#22059-47) Sloths on blue	3 ¼ yards	Pieced crosswise

Use ¼" Seam Allowance unless otherwise stated

**Side border**: Using Fabric B (5  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips), cut TWO pieces of fabric that equals 42  $\frac{1}{2}$ ". Match the center of the side border to the side center of the panel and pin. Match the ends of the side border to both ends of the border and pin. Sew the seams. Press towards the side border. Your piece should measure 33  $\frac{1}{2}$ " by 42  $\frac{1}{2}$ ".

Inner border: Using Fabric C (2 ½" strips), cut TWO pieces of fabric that equals 42 ½". Match the center of the inner border to the side center of the quilt and pin. Match the ends of the inner border to both ends of the quilt center and pin. Sew the seams. Press towards the inner border. Repeat this process for the top and bottom inner borders using the width (through the center) of the quilt as your measurement guide. Your piece should measure 37 ½" by 46 ½".

**Outer border**: Using Fabric D (5 ½" strips), cut TWO pieces of fabric that equals the length of the center of your quilt top (should be 46 ½"). Match the center of the outer border to the side center of the quilt top and pin. Match the ends of the outer border to both ends of the quilt top and pin. Sew the seams. Press towards the outer border. Repeat this process for the top and bottom outer borders using the width (through the center) of the quilt as your measurement guide. Your quilt top should measure 47 ½" by 56 ½".

NOTE: It is best to NOT prewash preprinted fabrics such as panels and border prints. The fabric goes through many processes to be delivered to the consumer and there may be some size variations. If you're unable to cut the panels/border prints to the sizes mentioned above, cut the pieces to a size that works for your panels and adjust any other measurements accordingly.
