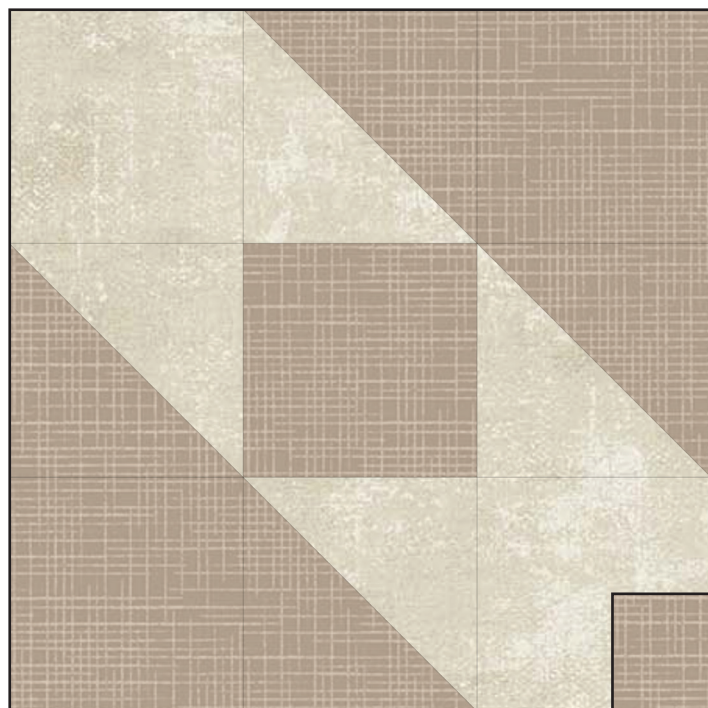


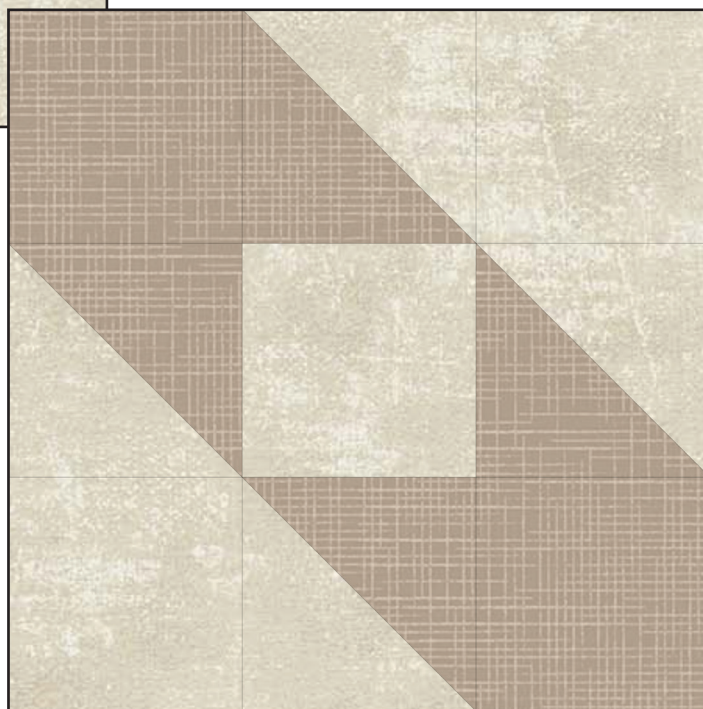

9030-13 & 9040-13



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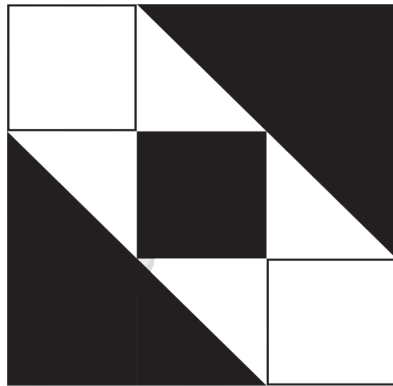

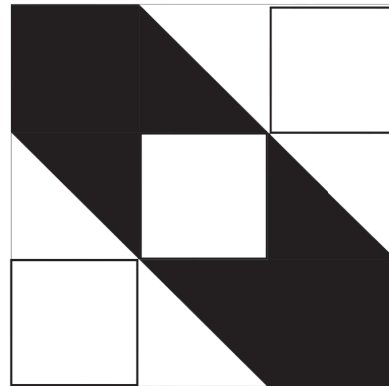
Block 7

FREE PATTERN

- Make the same block twice
- Blocks are mirror images
- Unfinished block size is 9 1/2"

2 contrasting fabrics - 1/8 yard each

Label your fabrics #1 and #2 (It doesn't matter which way you label them)

From each of the fabrics cut:

(1) 3 7/8" x WOF strip

Cut (4) 3 7/8" squares

Trim remaining fabric down to 3 1/2"

Cut (5) 3 1/2" squares

Block 7a. Take (2) 3 7/8 squares from fabric #1 and (2) 3 7/8 squares from fabric #2. Place one square of each fabric right sides together and draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of one of the squares. Pin. Stitch a scant 1/4" away from both sides of the drawn line. Cut apart on the drawn line and you have two sewn half square triangle units! Repeat this process to yield four sewn 3 1/2" half square triangle units. See diagram below.

Take (3) 3 1/2" squares from fabric #2 and place them in the lower left corner, upper right corner and the center. Take (2) 3 1/2" squares from fabric #1 and lay them in the upper left corner and the lower right corner. Place your half square triangle units as shown in Block 7a. diagram above and sew together.

Block 7b. Take (2) 3 7/8 squares from fabric #2 and (2) 3 7/8 squares from fabric #1. Place one square of each fabric right sides together and draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of one of the squares. Pin. Stitch a scant 1/4" away from both sides of the drawn line. Cut apart on the drawn line and you have two sewn half square triangle units! Repeat this process to yield four sewn 3 1/2" half square triangle units. See diagram below.

Take (3) 3 ½" squares from fabric #1 and place them in the lower left corner, upper right corner and the center. Take (2) 3 ½" squares from fabric #2 and lay them in the upper left corner and the lower right corner. Place your half square triangle units as shown in Block 7b. diagram above and sew together.
